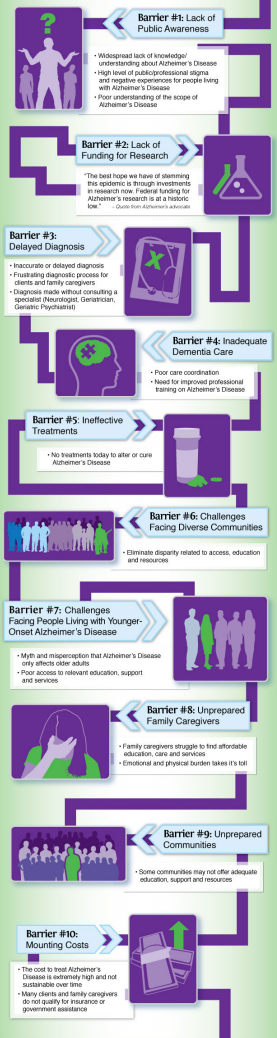

A Review of Barriers and Best Practices

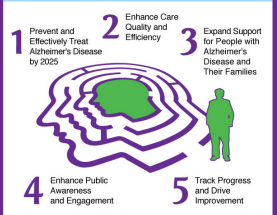
